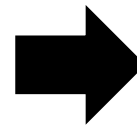
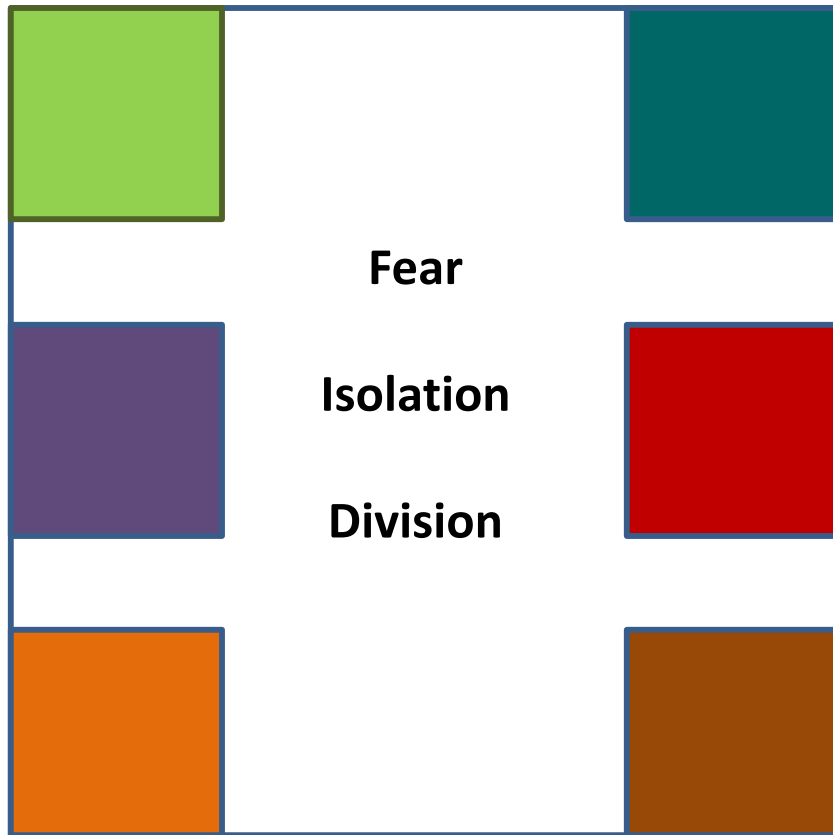


## Typical Community Environment

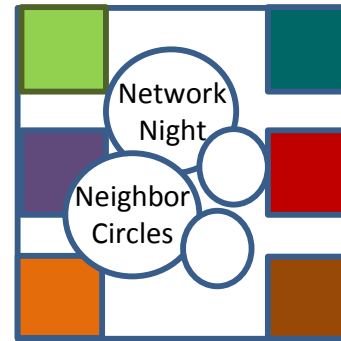

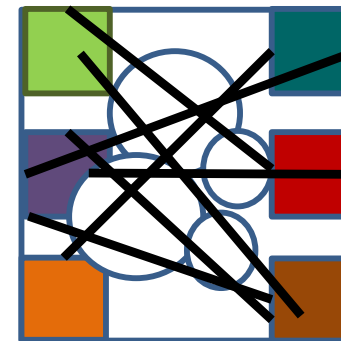

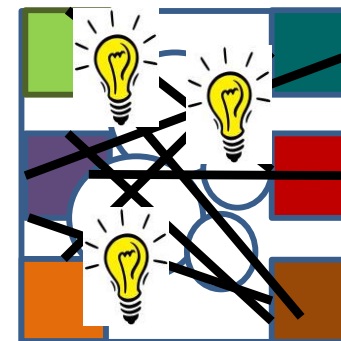
## Typical Community Environment

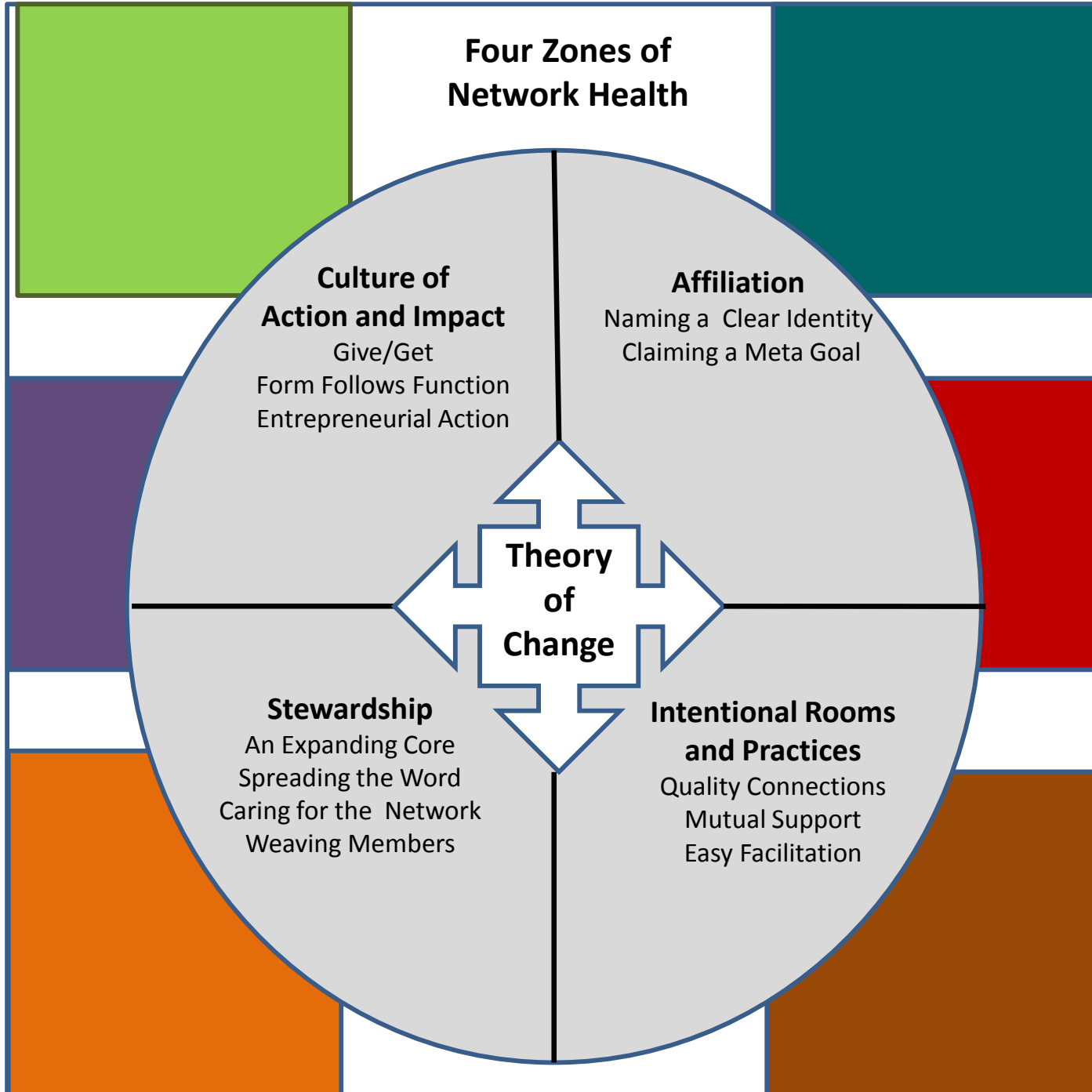

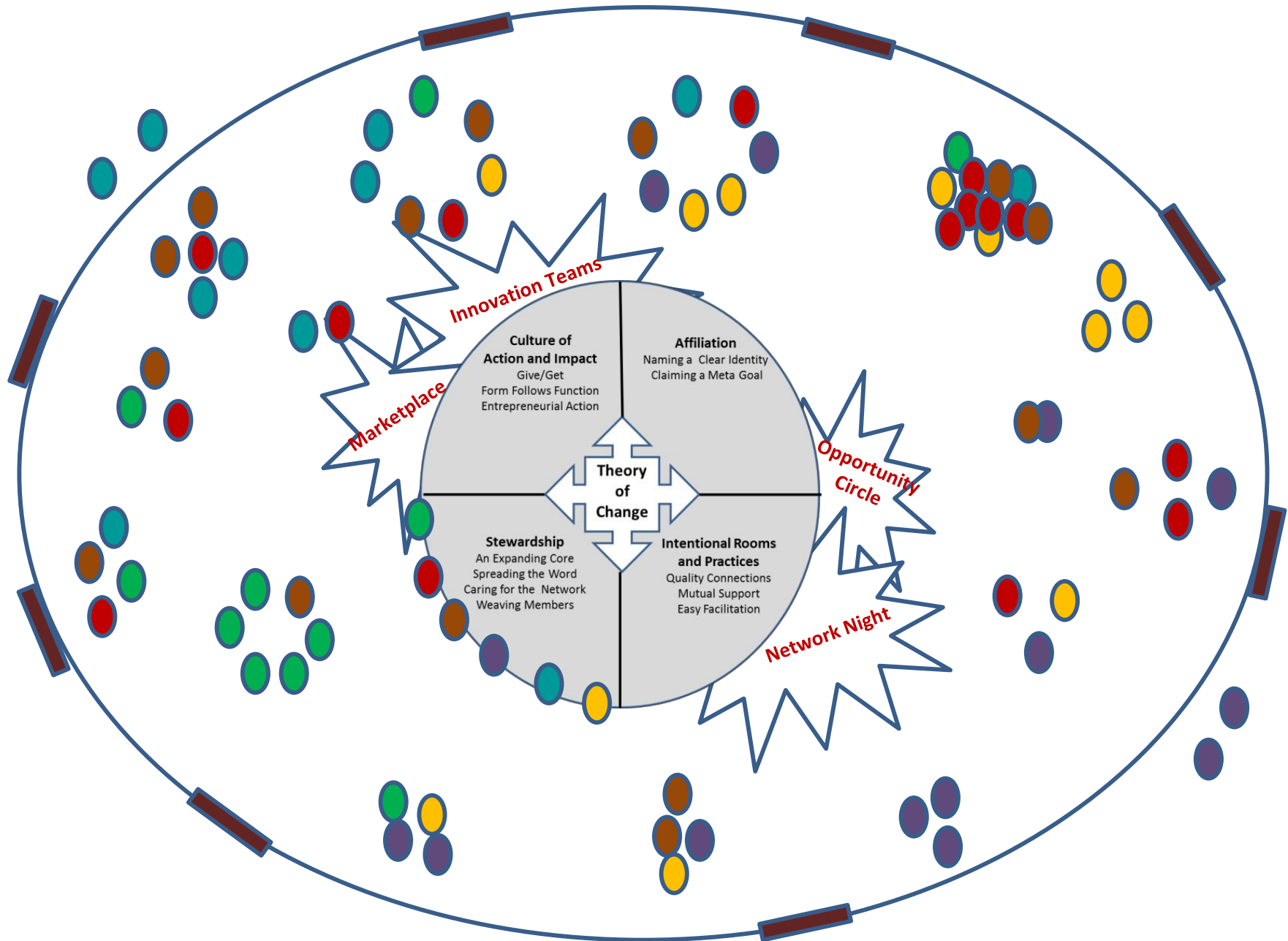

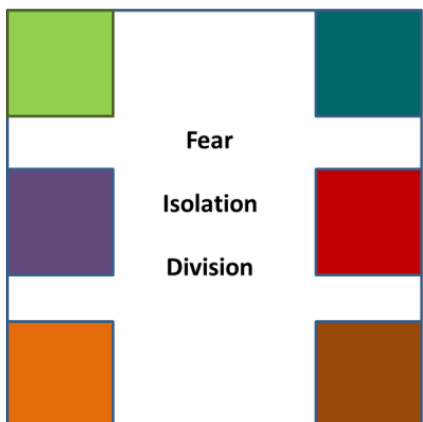
